

Dear IAHCE Members,

As I read about your activities in the newsletter, I'm so



excited about what you are all doing. We talked about County Brochures in our Workshop class. I suggested each county make up one and send them home with guests, especially 4-H youth when you do a program. One of the programs we did with the 4-H was a "No Cooking" food class and many of you requested two of the recipes. So here they are. Keep up the good work with our organizations----it's worth talking about.

CHICKEN CUPS

- 1/2 C light mayo
- 1/2 tsp. dried dillweed or lemon pepper seasoning
- 1 9 oz pkg. frozen chopped chicken breast thawed
- 1/2 C chopped broccoli
- 1/4 C purchased shredded carrots
- 28-32 baked scoop shaped tortilla chips

Put mayo and dillweed in a small bowl. Stir with wooden spoon to mix. Put chicken, broccoli and carrots in the medium bowl. Pour mayo mixture over chicken, toss to coat. Cover and chill in the refrigerator for up to 24 hrs. Serve in baked tortilla chips.

CHOCOLATE ROLLS

- 2 tbsp. butter, softened
- 1 tsp. vanilla extract
- 1/2 C unsweetened cocoa powder
- 3/4 C dry milk powder
- 3 C confectioner sugar
- 1/2 C white corn syrup

Mix ingredients together in a plastic bag. Knead like you would for bread and when mixed well, roll into a small log and cut into desired lengths.

hope all have been able to get all the state and federal reports done without much effort. I know I have had a few calls from counties with some problems. I am glad they call and that I am able to help, so please call me if you have issues with something. If I do not know the answer, I have great resource people that I can contact to get the answer for you.

By now you should have had the Pennies for Friendship mailed into me, if not, do so soon! The next thing you need to be getting done is your county dues in the mail and postmarked to me by January 15, 2012. Don't forget the transmittal sheet that needs to be sent with the dues check. The transmittal sheet can be found in the guidebook or on the IAHCE website. The importance of getting your dues to me in a timely manner is so your county is eligible to have voting delegates at the annual conference in March. Remember, too, that you pay dues on the number of members your county has as of December 31, 2011. The membership number should be the same number that is turned into the District Director by January 5, 2012. The District Director then turns that number into the state

Our Plano Unit of 35 members are "collectors extraordinaire". You name it, they collect it! They also sew—having sewn some 17 Linus quilts and 300 cough pillows but the collections are unbelievable! A few to mention: 450 batteries, 65 eye glasses, 4 gallons of can tabs, 550 egg cartons, 1,000 greeting cards to be redesigned for sale, 2,600 cancelled stamps, 190 thread spools, bags and bags of toiletries for veterans hospitals, used clothing and so much more. Their list of collectibles continues to grow.
