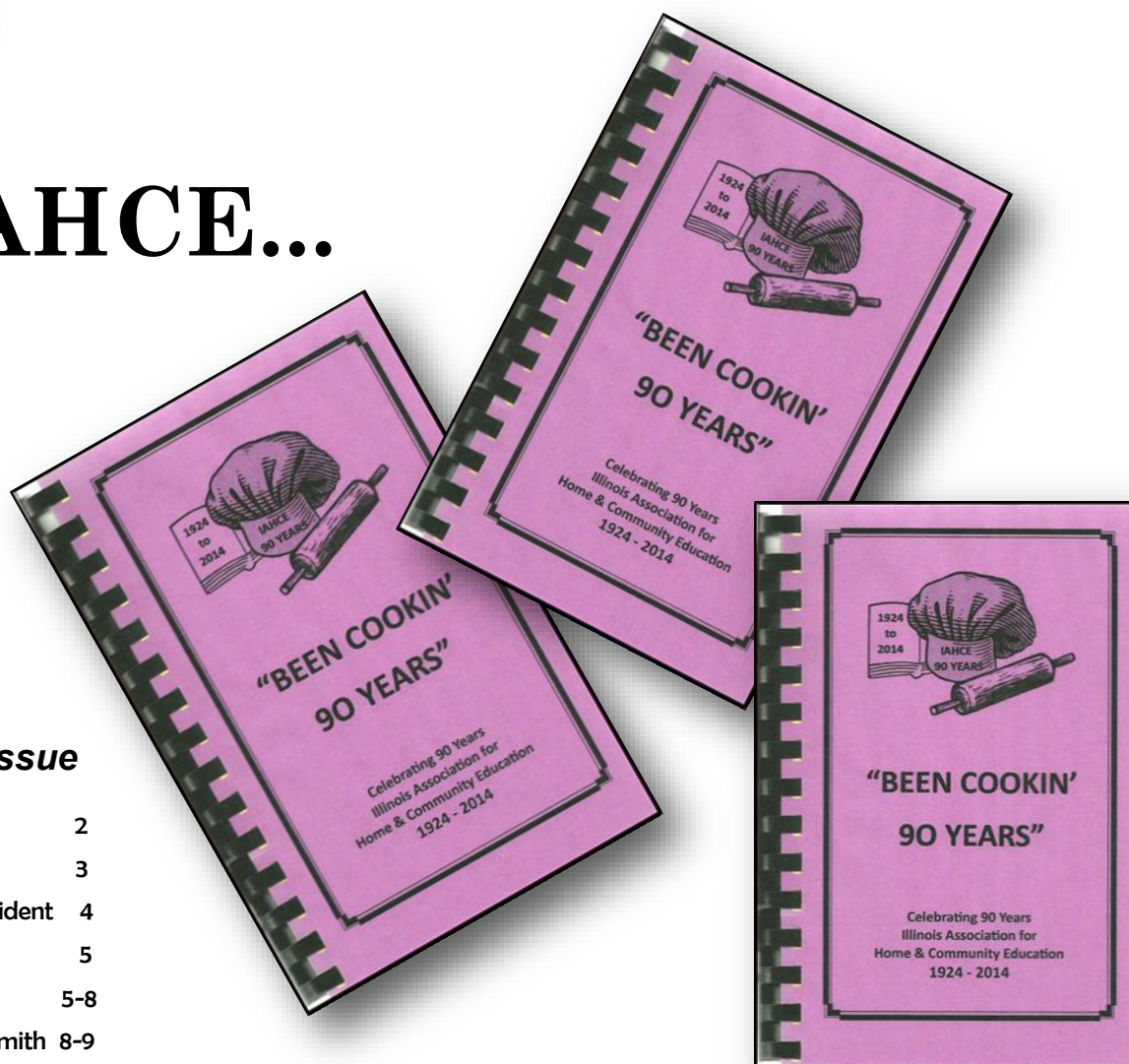

The IAHCE June Board Meeting in Decatur, IL was a busy and very productive four days for all 17 attendees. From my international education viewpoint, it was particularly good. We reviewed our finances, made donations, made plans for the August District Meetings, noted Illinois' growing participation in Women Walk, and furthered consideration of an International Inbound and Outbound Exchange of "homemakers".

IAHCE member contributions to Pennies for Friendship made it possible for us to donate monies to three youth oriented programs and an organization celebrating international friendship and peace. Donations were given to the Illinois 4-H Foundation \$500, International Four-H Youth Exchange (IFYE) \$500, Labo program (family based Japanese youth organization) \$600 and the International Peace Garden \$100.

By coincidence I met Anna Hevrdejs and her mother, Jill, at a farmer's market in Antioch, Illinois the day after the IAHCE Board approved the donation to IFYE. They were promoting the 4-H experience. Anna was noticeably excited to meet someone that knew of her upcoming trip to Japan and to hear how IAHCE supports 4-H youth. She will prepare a Power Point presentation about her IFYE trip and make some presentations on it. She looks forward to requests.

The International Peace Garden straddling the border of North Dakota and Manitoba is a 2,339 acre botanical garden with camping sites, summer camps that encourage cultural arts and athletics for young people, and more features.

I've been busy connecting with the Associated Country Women of the World, ACWW, on behalf of IAHCE members. I submitted articles to them

for possible publication in their magazine, The CountryWoman. The articles were about the IAHCE's 80th anniversary of our relationship with ACWW, and some of the Women Walk the World activities around our state.

Inquiries were made about adopting one of ACWW's new projects. Most interestingly I got a positive response when I contacted the ACWW Area President in Europe to do preliminary research on the possibility of an International Homemakers Exchange. University of Illinois Extension will once again be offering food preservation courses. We have just released our new online food preservation training, "Preserve the Taste of Summer" so that you can get detailed instructions on making jams and jellies, pickles, tomato products, pressure canned goods and more!

You can take the class at any time and in your own home in front of a computer! Register at <http://web.extension.illinois.edu/foodpreservation>.

Those that take the training will also be eligible to receive hands-on canning workshops held in various locations throughout the state. Plus, we are continuing to test pressure canner gauges in the class, "Yes! You Can: Preserving Safely." Call your local Extension office for more information.

Plus, University of Illinois Extension has a lot of new and exciting HCE lessons that will start in January of 2015. They include, "The ABC's of GMO's (Genetically Modified Organisms)" and "Eating Well as You Age" from the Nutrition and Wellness team, "Mindfulness and Soul Care" and "Someday is Today: Live Your Bucket List" from the Family Life team, and "Health Insurance for People 65+ Years" and "Saving Money on a Limited Budget" from the Consumer Economics team.

ROCK ISLAND.....

Once again we've "been cookin'" with activities all through this rainy springtime here in Rock Island County. State Conference was attended by five of our board members and three of them were there for the first time. It was a great learning experience for all, coming away from conference with ideas and the motivation to implement them.

On March 29 we held our "Spring Fling," a multi-craft day with six enticing crafts (cards, candles, T-shirt scarves, butterflies, coasters, and knitted scarves) from which to select. Around thirty-five attendees enjoyed the day creating several of the possibilities, and they requested another such activity next year.

International Day, April 22, Father Ed den Blaauwen, pastor of Christ Church in Moline, IL, spoke of his early life in South Africa where he was born and lived until 13 years ago. The crowd, including many guests, were privileged to learn through his multi-media presentation and question/answer session. It proved to be an extremely, worthwhile learning experience. This was followed by a bountiful luncheon of twelve native dishes indicative of South African fare.

One of our fund-raising projects, geranium sales, to be delivered in early May, was affected by the late growing season. It was rescheduled for a week later. Sales were up this year with a profit near \$3800, to be shared with the 4-H program.

The three Spring work days using recycled materials to make projects for the Rock Island County Fair was well-attended. An abundance of articles were distributed on June 18-22. This group of workers continue to contribute their time, talent, and supplies, under the direction of Nancy Edlund, Recycling and Community Outreach Director, to make this event a success.

In the early Spring, Recycling and Community Outreach Dir., Nancy Edlund, shared a request from the Veterans Assn. for one hundred (100) large bags for Stand Down Days. These bags would be presented to Homeless Veterans attending Stand Down 2014, at the QC Expo Center in Rock Island,

IL on Sept. 18-20, where they receive donated services and supplies/clothing. The bags would provide them with a vehicle in which to carry donated supplies and clothing that they receive at that time. The bags had to be made of sturdy fabric and be about 30" x 45" with a drawstring top.

Upper county units, Cordova and Riverdale, began their endeavor on June 4, cutting about 60+ sets and sewing them together. Some were finished and many sets taken home to continue. A follow-up workday will be July 22. A county-wide workday is also scheduled for September 12 at Christ Church in Moline, IL.

The County Annual Meeting on June 21 was held at Christ Church in Moline, IL with approximately 60 in attendance including guests. Members wore aprons, table decorations were mini-aprons, and program booklets were adorned with recipe files.

A Memorial service, followed by reports, new member recognition, attendance awards and recognition, election and installation of officers, and special recognition for Riverdale Unit for it's 50th year of organization. Lucille Mumma, original member of 50 years, was presented a certificate, gift, and a basket of cooking utensils, one for each unit member.

The adjournment of the business meeting led to our special program, "The Recycling Quilter." Cheryl Lennox, member of Cordova unit, presented her many projects from quilts to collages to aprons describing what and how she created each with emphasis on the recycled materials used. Included in her display were quilted projects that won awards and that traveled internationally on display. A delicious casserole and dessert luncheon followed.

The retired board members and newly-elected members met June 24 for lunch and a get-acquainted board meeting at Welcome Inn in Milan, IL. Planning began on program booklets for the upcoming year.

SUMMER!!

We have started the 2014 summer with plenty of rain, so the crops are really taking off! However, it has been difficult to make hay, especially baling any dry hay. Even the lawn mowing (about every five days) has kept us very busy!

Back on Saturday, April 5, the Quad County Heritage Arts Workshop was held at the Lee County Council on Aging in Dixon, Illinois. There were many classes on many different subjects. Lynn Lott, Stephenson County HCE Cultural Enrichment Director, taught a class on making Corn Husk Roses.

On April 25 and 26, HCE ran the Cub's Brat Stand in Freeport. The Cub Foods grocery chain offers non-profit organizations the chance to earn money for their group by operating their stand. This money-making opportunity has become so popular that groups are lucky if they can get a weekend (mid-March thru mid-November) once every two years. The weather was wonderful and, with the help of many HCE and other volunteers, we were able to boost our treasury with a \$2,000 profit!

On May 21, the Stephenson County HCE annual meeting was held at the Farm Bureau Building in Freeport. We had our business meeting and the election and installation of county officers. We were served a catered lunch of Kentucky Fried Chicken and homemade brownie bars made by several HCE members. IAHC President Marilyn Daughhetee provided the program on her trip to the ACWW Triennial in Chennai, India.

On June 4, we really started to think about the upcoming summer activities with a clean-up day at our HCE dining hall at the Stephenson County Fairgrounds.

Saturday, June 28, the annual Stephenson County Ag Breakfast was held at the fairgrounds. This popular event feeds breakfast to 100's of people for a very reasonable donation. It takes many volunteers from different organizations to prepare

and serve this breakfast. Our HCE members bake and donate coffee cakes as well as serve and clean up after guests.

We had a booth at the Ag Breakfast with information on HCE and copies of past HCE lessons, as well as recipes to hand out. We also had an interesting display of "Look-A-Like Poisons." Can you tell the difference between a sugar substitute tablet and a heart pill? Reese's Pieces candy and an Arthritis pain pill? Cough syrup and grape juice? There were 18 different combinations displayed at the booth. Most homes have at least two dozen possibly lethal household products. About 4,000 people die from poisoning each year!

As I write this article, we are looking ahead to the July 4th Fireworks at the Stephenson County Fairgrounds. SCAHCE sells homemade pie and ice cream before the fireworks.

The Stephenson County Fair runs from July 8-13 and HCE will again be operating the dining hall.

Don't ever save anything for a special occasion..... being alive is the special occasion! Looking forward to seeing you at the District Workshop!

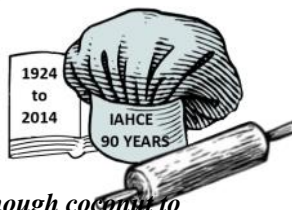

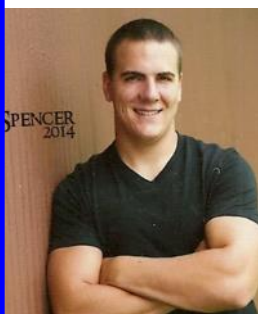
SCHOLARSHIP WINNERS
